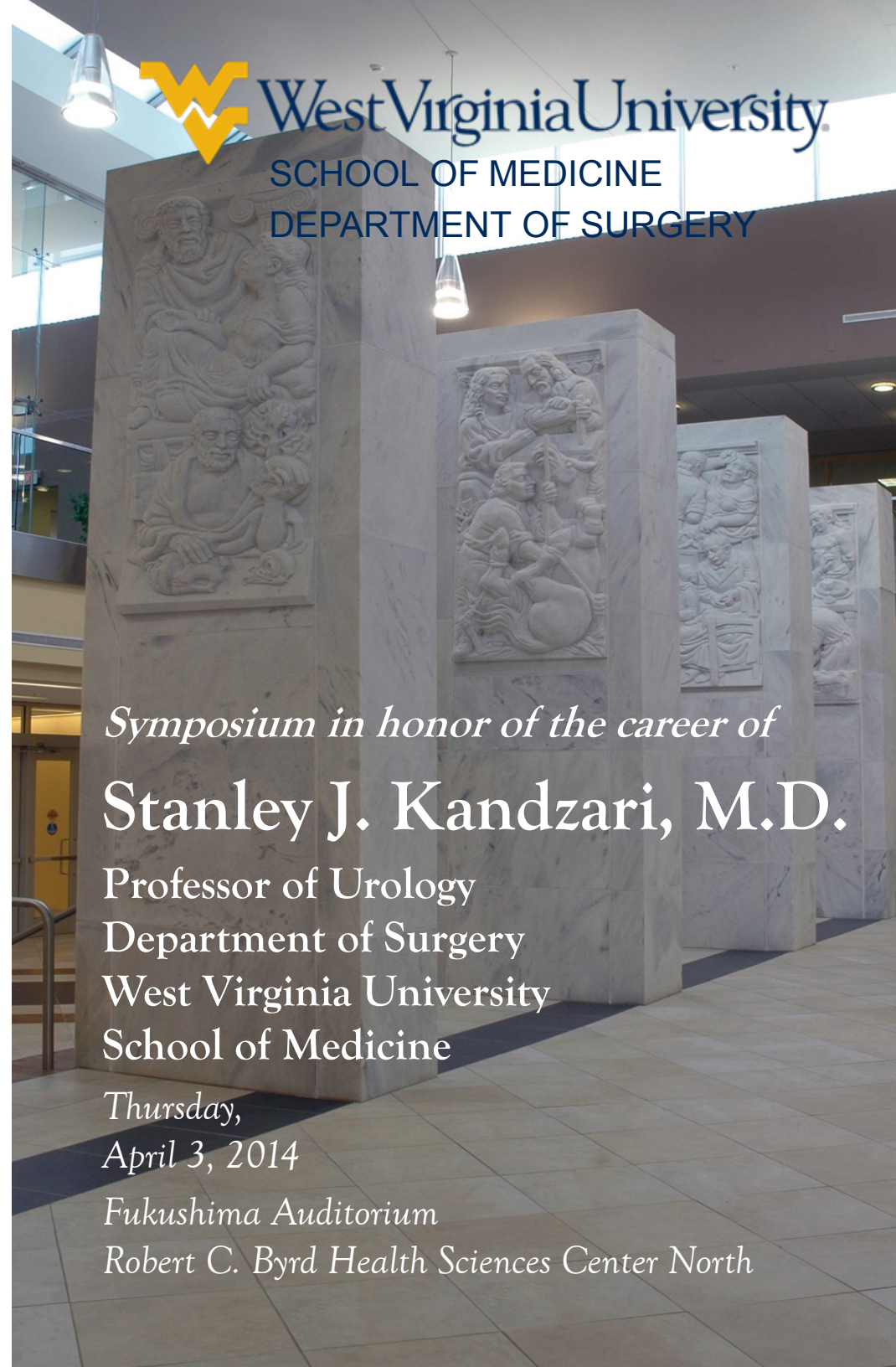

Stanley J. Kandzari, M.D.

Stanley J. Kandzari, M.D., was born in Morgantown and grew up in Granville, WV. He graduated from Morgantown High School in 1955. He was four-year dean's list awardee as an undergraduate at WVU. He graduated from the WVU School of Medicine in 1963 in its first four-year class. After completing his



internship at Allegheny General Hospital in Pittsburgh he served in the US Army stationed for 13 months in the demilitarized zone in Korea and at Walter Reed General Hospital. After his honorable discharge, he trained in urology at WVU Hospital (1966 - 1970). Joining the WVU faculty in 1970 as instructor, he became full professor rank in 1978. He was appointed program director of urology in 1992 and division chief in 2002. He has held positions in major urologic professional organizations, including president of the WV chapter of the American College of Surgeons and the mid-Atlantic section of the American Urological Association, and board member of the AUA. A

master clinician he has called upon to take on the most challenging of cases and for his advice on several-fold more. Thousands of Mountaineers have had the good fortune to be his patients. More than 100 urologists name him as having inspired them to go into the field as students, or trained them as residents. Known throughout the WVU community as "Coach," he has the affection that the best of mentors receive.
