



Ferrari III, MD '82, vice dean for medical education and chair, Department of Medical Education, West Virginia University School of Medicine, will present " A History of Graduate Medical Education--Past, Present and Future." DISTINGUISHED ALUMNUS



Norman D. Ferrari, III, MD, is vice dean for education and academic affairs and founding chair of the Department of Medical Education at WVU School of Medicine. A graduate of the class of 1982, Ferrari is a nationally recognized leader with a significant academic portfolio. He currently sits on the ACGME's national Board of Directors, has served on LCME accreditation teams and held senior positions within the American Board of Pediatrics. He received the ACGME's highest honor, the Parker J. Palmer Courage to Lead Award, recognizing his excellence in overseeing WVU residency programs.

Since joining the WVU School of Medicine faculty in 1986, Ferrari has held several leadership positions including interim chair for pediatrics, medical director of the Physician Office Center, associate dean for ambulatory services,

designated institutional official (DIO) for GME and interim associate vice president for health sciences and interim dean of medicine for the Charleston Campus. He helped establish the School's Gold Humanism Honor Society (GHHS) and is the faculty advisor.

At WVU, Ferrari has received numerous awards, including Outstanding Resident Teacher, Clinician of the Year, twice named Distinguished Teacher of the Year, the David Z. Morgan Mentor Award, the John W. Traubert Mentor Award and WVU Foundation Outstanding Teacher. He is an associate member of Mountain Honorary, received the Dean's Award for Excellence for Service to School and was inducted into the WVU Academy of Excellence in Teaching and Learning. He is the coordinator for the rural health educational programs and curriculum and for his contributions to rural health education in West Virginia, he received the Judith Kandzari Award.

With respect to his scholarly activities, Ferrari has an abundance of publications, abstracts and presentations. He has been a PI and Co-PI for clinical trials and is a reviewer for several journals. He is board certified by both the American Board of Pediatrics and the American Board of Internal Medicine.

In his letter of recommendation, John E. Prescott, chief academic officer, American Association of Medical Colleges, said, "At every state in his career, Norman has brought great credit and recognition to the WVU School of Medicine. There is no doubt that his work and contributions have made a significant and lasting impact on WVU, the School of Medicine, as well as West Virginia and our nation. He is a true Mountaineer and an outstanding WVU alumnus."
