Faculty Clinical Practice

The faculty practice continued to grow this year by offering new clinical services. The faculty, through University Health Associates (UHA), provided 824 outpatient visits this past year. Faculty provide physical therapy in a variety unique niche and specialty practice areas including women's health, vestibular and balance, pediatrics, orthopedic, neurologic, cancer, cardiopulmonary, and spine triage/referral services. Several faculty also practice in multi-disciplinary medical teams, medical/surgical specialty clinics, or provide in-patient physical therapy at Ruby Memorial Hospital.

New Balance Center

The Division in collaboration with the Dr. Stephen Wetmore, Chair of Otolaryngology started a new clinical service for those with Balance and Vestibular Rehabilitation needs. The Balance Center is located in the Physician Office Center. Consultation is available by Otolaryngologists, Audiologists and the PT faculty (Corrie Mancinelli –Coordinator, Ralph Utzman, and Tracy Rice) working as a team to ensure that patients with balance deficits receive comprehensive care. As part of the program development, Tracy Rice PT, NCS attended and passed Vestibular Rehabilitation: A Competency-Based Course Sponsored by: Department of Rehabilitation Medicine Emory University School of Medicine and the APTA.

Visiting Scholars Series

The Division was pleased to have **Michelle Lusardi PT, PhD** from Sacred Heart University on campus on April 13, 2011. Dr. Lusardi is Professor Emeritus of Physical Therapy and the current Editor-in-Chief of the Geriatric Physical Therapy Journal. Dr. Lusardi is best known for her research and dedication to educating other physical therapists about the role of gait speed as the “Sixth Vital Sign.” She gave a very informative presentation to faculty, staff, and local clinicians regarding this topic. She was also available for faculty consultation regarding research and curricular discussion.

Dr. Gritsenko will assist Dr. Mandich with teaching selected units of the neurophysiology curriculum.

Dr. Evans joined the faculty in March 2011. She is a 2004 WVU Physical Therapy graduate. After leaving the halls of WVU, Dr. Evans completed a Transitional DPT degree from Virginia Commonwealth University. Prior to joining the faculty, she practiced for 7 years in a variety of clinical settings including outpatient orthopedics, acute care, clinical and school-based pediatrics, home health care, and skilled nursing facilities. She will be coordinating several foundational courses including PT Procedures (transfers and gait training) and coordinating the one-day clinical education experiences.

Scholarship—Different Types, but All Are Important to PT

Anne K. Swisher PT, PhD, CCS—Director of Scholarship Development

What is scholarship? It can be seen as the systematic approach to a problem. It comes in many forms, which include the creation of new knowledge, critical analysis or synthesis of existing knowledge, applying findings to solve real problems in the clinic, critically evaluating teaching and learning, and applying knowledge to solve problems in society. The faculty and students of the Division of Physical therapy are very active in scholarship in many of these forms. As Director of Scholarship Development, it is my role to help faculty match their interests and abilities with approaches to solving problems in physical therapy. Simultaneously, we involve students and clinicians as partners in this problem-solving endeavor. Here is a partial list of scholarly projects led by faculty and assisted by students. Many of these have been presented and published in prestigious journals:

- Use of video gaming systems to explore movement relearning following stroke and other neurological insults (Dr. Gritsenko)
- Clinical predictors of chronic low back pain (Dr. Davis, Dr. Mancinelli and Prof. Petronis) and cystic fibrosis related diabetic neuropathy (Dr. Swisher and Dr. Mancinelli)
- Examining motor characteristics of children with Autism Spectrum Disorder (Dr. Mandich and Dr. Mancinelli)
- Effect of traumatic brain injury on balance (Prof Rice and Dr. Mancinelli)
- Physical activity interventions for people with arthritis (Dr. Jones) and breast cancer survivors (Dr. Swisher)
- Examinations of nationwide orthopedic PT curricula (Dr. Davis), the role of expert witnesses (Dr. Davis), the impact of changes in clinical education on rural clinics (Dr. Erickson), and characterizing PT workforce in West Virginia (Dr. Utzman)
- Creating and/or validating outcome measures in PT for upper extremity problems (Dr. Erickson), thumb joint surgery (Dr. Waggy) and wrist/hand function in breast cancer survivors (Dr. Swisher and Dr. Erickson)

Students are involved in all of these projects, learning alongside faculty mentors what is involved in trying to answer these important clinical questions. By their involvement, they have a better understanding of the challenges of true evidence-based practice. Several students have recently presented their work to others in the profession. (See photos below from the WVPTA annual meeting in April). Scholarship is the responsibility of every PT, clinician, student, educator and researcher. Each of us has questions that need to be answered to help our patients reach their maximal potential and our profession to its highest level.
