

DISTINGUISHED ALUMNUS



Peter M. Murray, MD, professor and chair of the Department of Orthopedic Surgery at Mayo Clinic in Florida, specializes in hand surgery and microsurgery, with a special interest in surgical reconstruction of peripheral nerve injuries, including brachial plexus reconstruction.

A native of Parkersburg, West Virginia, Dr. Murray earned a bachelor's degree in chemistry and graduated magna cum laude from West Virginia University and completed his Doctor of Medicine degree in 1985. He completed his orthopedic surgery training at the University of Iowa Hospitals and Clinics

in Iowa City, Iowa, followed by a fellowship in hand and microsurgery at Mayo Clinic, Rochester, Minnesota.

Dr. Murray is a distinguished graduate of the United States Air Force ROTC program at WVU and served on active duty, rising to the rank of Lt. Colonel. He was deployed in support of the Operation Desert Storm campaign in 1991 and received the USAF Meritorious Service Medal and the USAF Commendation Medal.

Dr. Murray is past president of the American Board of Orthopedic Surgery (ABOS) and is currently a senior director for the ABO, chairing the Combined Committee on Surgery of the Hand. He is past president of the American Association for Hand Surgery, and currently chairs the Orthopedic Surgery Residency Review Committee (RRC) for the Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education (ACGME).

He has authored more than 125 scientific publications and three books. He lectures internationally on hand surgery and has been a visiting professor at 18 United States institutions. He received the "Healthcare Hero Award" by the Jacksonville Business Journal and has received Jacksonville's "Top Doctor" award numerous times.
