Professor of Obstetrics and Gynecology at the University of Pittsburgh School of Medicine

- Investigator, the Magee-Womens Research Institute, Director of MWRI satellite in Erie, PA
- Founding Director of Division of Urogynecology and Reconstructive Pelvic Surgery at the University of Pittsburgh and the Women's Center for Bladder and Pelvic Health at Magee-Womens Hospital.

Dr. Halina Zyczynski is an internationally recognized leader in *Female Pelvic Medicine and Reconstructive Surgery*. In 1996 she founded the Women's Center for Bladder and Pelvic Health at Magee-Womens Hospital, a diagnostic and treatment resource for women with pelvic organ prolapse, urinary and fecal incontinence and childbirth associated disorders. As a clinical trialist, she has garnered the voices, symptom burden, and treatment outcomes of thousands of women in 16 multicenter clinical trials designed and conducted by the NIH sponsored Pelvic Floor Disorders Network and the Urinary Incontinence Treatment Network. The clinical trials have informed on the:

- impact of childbirth on bladder, bowel and sexual function
- patient satisfaction with non-surgical treatments such as pessaries and PT
- clinical impact and cost effectiveness of diagnostic testing
- anatomic and functional outcomes after native tissue and mesh augmented prolapse and incontinence surgery

At the conclusion of this lecture, attendees should be able to:

- Apply study results in individual patient counseling
- Relay the nuances of anatomic, functional and quality of life results after vaginal prolapse surgery
- Address patient concerns regarding sexual function after surgery
- Identify beneficiaries of adjunct behavioral and physical therapy to optimize sling outcomes
- Recognize patients at higher risk for prolapse recurrence and re-treatment

About Antonio Palladino, M.D.

A native of Italy, Dr. Antonio Palladino received his medical degree with highest honors from the University of Naples, Italy, and served his residency in obstetrics and gynecology at Baltimore City Hospital, University of Maryland Division.

As a faculty member in the Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology at West Virginia University from 1964-1974, Dr. Palladino served as vice-chairman and director of the student teaching program. He later served as a clinical professor and was on the staff at Monongalia General Hospital. From 1974 until his death in June 1991, Dr. Palladino practiced with Drs. Walter A. Bonney and Kamal M. Behnam in Morgantown. He was certified by the American Board of Obstetrics and Gynecology and the Italian Board of Obstetrics and Gynecology.

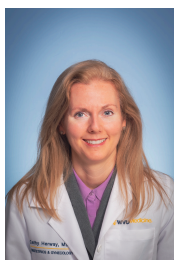

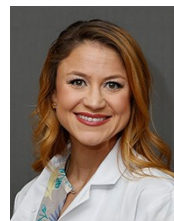
