Department of Family Medicine 5th Annual Research Day



The 5th Annual WVU Department of Family Medicine Research Day was held on Friday, October 20 in Morgantown. Faculty, residents, and students heard five oral presentations and attended the poster session. Poster session judges Dr. Ruben Tinajero and Dr. Cassandra Homick served as poster

session judges, with Dr. Josh Moore's Finding Wellness team poster and Drs. Unger & Pilkerton's case report poster winning the resident and faculty poster awards, respectively. For the first time this year, the poster session included an "Audience Favorite" voted on by attendees, and Dr. Unger and Pilkerton's case report poster was voted the favorite. The event closed out with "Research Speed Dating" that led to new and unique research and QI project ideas.

Direct Oral Anticoagulants: Probability of Recurrent Venous Thromboembolism and Bleeding Risk in an Obese Population





Objective: This investigation evaluated whether s patients with a BMI 35 kg/m2or greater who

were prescribed a DOAC had a higher risk for a recurrent VTE or bleed event relative to warfarin.

Findings: Of the total study population from the West Virginia University Health System, (1,633), 2.3% (37) had a recurrent thrombotic event, 5.5% (89) had a major bleed event, and 10.7% (174) had some type of bleeding event. No individual patient characteristic was associated with recurrent thrombosis – including BMI. Older age, antiplatelet use, and taking a medication with a theoretical risk of increasing the effect of DOACs were associated with any and major bleeding events. The use of warfarin was associated with major bleeding events more frequently versus a DOAC. BMI was not a predictor for recurrent VTE or any bleed or major bleed events. These findings support the conclusion that DOACs are an appropriate and effective drug class for the management of venous thromboembolism in patients with obesity.

Project History: The idea for this project originated with Dr. Shaylee Peckens in 2017. When Dr. Ashcraft joined the Department of Family Medicine faculty in Fall 2018, she and Dr. Pilkerton began working with a team of interested residents and faculty to develop the study and manuscript. Over the course of five years, they met numerous times with CTSI staff members to obtain the necessary data and worked with collaborators to conduct iterative rounds of chart review. After the arduous journey, the team is thrilled to announce the article is currently in press at the Annals of Pharmacotherapy.
