

WVU Medicine Eastern Division is recruiting for a postdoctoral fellowship that specializes in rural mental health. The position will include training opportunities to work with individuals across the lifespan in an outpatient mental health clinic located on the campus of WVU Medicine Eastern Division's medical school as well as in a rural primary care clinic with a specific emphasis on integrated primary care (IPC) treatment. There may be additional training opportunities based on provider interest and community need to include Parent-Child Interaction Therapy (PCIT), integrated primary care treatment in other family medicine clinics, diabetes, obesity, chronic pain, eating disorders, psychological testing, posttraumatic stress disorder, Dialectical Behavior Therapy, autism testing, group therapy, and pediatrics.

This one-year, fulltime postdoctoral position will be within the Department of Behavioral Medicine and Psychiatry for the 2026-2027 academic year. Start date will be **August 4, 2026**. The salary is \$55,020 per annum with an additional \$3500 available for Continuing Medical Education (CME) expenses (e.g. training workshops, conference attendance, EPPP study materials, etc.). Vacation, sick leave, health insurance, CME days (5), and other benefits are provided as an employee of Berkeley Medical Center. Malpractice claims are covered; no additional professional insurance needs to be obtained. There may be potential for promotion to a faculty-level position upon completion of the program and obtainment of a license to practice psychology in the state of West Virginia.

This is a unique opportunity to join a well-established department within a prestigious academic medical setting allowing you to earn the clinical hours and training required for licensure while making a positive impact on the Eastern Panhandle of West Virginia and surrounding areas. In addition to providing Behavioral Health services, candidates can participate in scholarly activities to include giving educational presentations, medical student and resident education, and supervision of psychology interns.

Applicants must possess a Ph.D. or Psy.D. in psychology from a clinical or counseling psychology graduate program and have completed an APA/CPA-accredited internship. Preference is given to candidates with specialized training and experience in primary care psychology. In addition, applicants must be immediately eligible to receive a Gold Card to practice psychology in West Virginia under the supervision of a licensed psychologist.

WVU Medicine is West Virginia University's affiliated health system, West Virginia's largest private employer, and a national leader in patient safety and quality. It has more

than 1,000 active medical staff members and 15,000 employees who serve hundreds of thousands of people each year from across the state of West Virginia and the nation. Martinsburg, with a population of 17,000 residents, is the fastest growing city in the state of West Virginia. Located in the heart of the Eastern Panhandle, Martinsburg is often referred to as the "gateway to the Shenandoah Valley." Approximately 75 miles outside of Washington, D.C. and 90 miles outside of Baltimore, MD, Martinsburg balances the proximal benefits of being close to a major metropolitan area with the relaxed nature and beauty of a small town. It offers breathtaking views and beautiful scenery. Martinsburg is conveniently located between Maryland and Virginia, offering the ability to travel into either state within 20 minutes. The Eastern Panhandle of West Virginia is located in a rich historical area with easy access to the C&O Canal, Appalachian Trail, and Antietam National Battlefield. In addition, the area is home to several recreational, cultural, and arts festivals each year, including the Apple Harvest Festival and the Leitersburg Peach Festival.

The application deadline is **January 1, 2026** although candidates are encouraged to apply earlier. Applications will continue to be accepted after the deadline if there are any unfilled positions.
